GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Children’s Art Centre’s Vacation Arts Program is a full day, arts-based program for children ages 4.5 to 12. Children will engage in visual arts projects, and are encouraged to work on original creations with freedom to use their imaginations for innovation and creative problem-solving. The Vacation Arts Program is a non-competitive environment that encourages each young artist to develop their interests, grow in their own personal style and work with others as they explore the world of art. Children also participate in additional weekly enrichment classes such as yoga and dance and attend an arts and cultural field trip every Friday.

Summer Arts Program Support Staff will report to the Director of Arts & Culture to gain valuable professional experience in youth development and classroom management.

QUALIFICATIONS

1. Must be at least 18 years of age and have a high school diploma or equivalent, with at least 6 months experience working with school-age children
2. A Bachelor's Degree or an Associate's Degree is preferred, and have at least 3 months of experience working with school-age children
3. Have a demonstrated interest and commitment to working with children and families is necessary
4. Ability to collaborate and work with others on a team
5. Experience preparing and implementing activities for a diverse group of children (age, ability, etc)

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Directly supervise groups of 12 children between the ages of 4.5 – 12 years old
2. Be responsible for leading structured activities
3. Maintain a safe, welcoming and clean environment
4. Supervise free-time, help to serve meals, and chaperone children on field-trips
5. Cover staff breaks
6. Substitute class if an instructor is sick
7. Complete other duties as assigned.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Must be able to climb, balance, stoop, kneel, crouch, reach, stand, walk, push, pull, lift, finger, grasp, feel, talk, hear, and be capable of repetitive motion

- Position requires exerting up to 20 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 10 pounds of force frequently, and/or a negligible amount of force constantly
- Work requires close visual acuity
- Position is not substantially exposed to adverse environmental conditions
