CAMP NURSE

United South End Settlements (USES) is a community-based nonprofit organization serving children, teens, adults, and seniors through programs in art, education, technology, and social services. USES operates in three locations in the South End – Harriet Tubman House, South End House, the Children’s Art Centre – and Camp Hale on Squam Lake in New Hampshire. Camp Hale was established in 1900, Camp Hale operates on the belief that all youth, particularly those from urban environments, will benefit from challenging opportunities for physical, mental, and social growth and development. **The goal of Camp Hale** is for each camper to leave camp with an enhanced sense of well-being, improved social skills, and awareness of personal potential. Each summer, 200 young men and women ages 6 to 15 years old head to lakeside cabins in the heart of the White Mountains, located on Squam Lake in New Hampshire

The Camp Hale Season is two and a half months long with four camping sessions –sessions I & II for boys 6 to 14 years old, and sessions III & IV for girls 6 to 14 years old.

Summer 2017 Camp Staff must be available from June 18 through August 26.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Camp Nurse manages the camp health center by providing healthcare to campers and staff. She or he maintains accurate medical records of campers and staff members, and reviews and updates camp health-care policies.

QUALIFICATIONS: Candidate must be a mature individual with at least five (5) years of experience in nursing and is a **Registered Nurse (RN), Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), or Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner (ARNP)**. Strong communication and interpersonal skills required. Experience in emergency treatment, preferred. Knowledge of camp healthcare policy development and experience working with youth also preferred. Must have a vehicle and be available mid-June to mid-August. Candidate must have New Hampshire nursing license by first day of Camp.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Review and update camp health policies; Administer medications and maintain camp infirmary; Train staff in basic first aid and health maintenance during training week and for duration of camp season; Treat illnesses and accidents of campers and staff; Administrative responsibility for filing insurance/claims forms and other related information which includes accurate recording of camp files; Perform other job-related duties as required.
